Junior Scholars' Training Seminar (JSTS)

Background Information

East European Studies of the Woodrow Wilson Center and the Committee on Eastern European Studies of the American Council on Learned Societies are soliciting applications for the annual training seminar for junior scholars in East European studies from August 13 – 16, 2010. The seminar will be held on the Chesapeake Bay in Maryland. All domestic transportation, accommodations and meal costs will be covered by the sponsors.

Eligibility

These scholarships are available to American citizens or permanent residents. Graduate students enrolled in an advanced academic or professional degree at an American university are eligible to apply. Preference will be given to those who have completed all requirements for their Ph.D. except the dissertation and scholars who have received their Ph.D.s within the past year in any field.

Projects on Central Europe and the Baltic states are eligible.

All projects should aim to highlight their potential policy relevance. Disciplines represented at recent Junior Scholars' Training Seminars have included anthropology, history, political science and Slavic languages and literatures.

Selected JSTS participants will be invited to discuss their work, as well as the state of their respective fields, with a number of senior scholars over a three-day event in early August at the Wye Woods Conference Center in Maryland.

Program Description

JSTS successfully combines formal and informal meetings to promote a variety of intellectual exchanges. Past activities have included:

- individual presentations;
- constructive feedback and question and answer sessions;
- one-on-one meetings for Junior Scholars with Senior Scholars;
- advice regarding publishing;
- discussions about the state of the profession and obtaining employment in the field;
- various social activities.

Additional Requirements

Selected applicants are expected to submit a five-page paper no later than July 2, 2010 on the sources and methodology of their report and the wider significance of their work. (In other words, what was researched, how it was researched, and what it all means.) This paper will serve as the basis for discussion at the seminar.



INSTRUCTIONS FOR JSTS APPLICANTS

The Application

A complete application must include the following:

1. Completed JSTS Application Form;
2. a one page, single-spaced statement of the work you wish to discuss at JSTS - either a dissertation, a thesis or another project; and,
3. one letter of recommendation from an academic advisor.

JSTS Statement

The elements requested below should be incorporated into the statement:

1. a description of the topic and potential policy relevance;
2. the originality of the proposed study;
3. the basic ideas and hypotheses; and,
4. the methods or approaches to be used.

Letter of Reference

One letter of reference from your advisor must be sent directly to EES by the application deadline of April 16, 2010. The letter should follow the guidelines for referees in the Reference Letter Form included in this packet.

Your academic advisor should be sent a copy of your JSTS project description so that s/he can comment specifically upon:

1. the proposed study;
2. the importance and originality of the project;
3. the quality of the proposal in definition, organization, clarity and scope; and,
4. the capabilities and achievements of the applicant.

These scholarships are available to American citizens or permanent residents. Junior scholars working on policy relevant projects related to Eastern Europe or Baltic studies (Russia, the Soviet successor states and Germany are excluded) are eligible to apply.

All application materials must be received by April 16, 2010.
